As we enter a new year, some of us long for the "good old days" - a time before the internet, a time before the emergence of cell phones. A time where our politicians were civil with each other, even gathered together for special outings and parties. However, no matter how much we wish differently, the world is changing at a rapid pace and we have little control. This constant change has impacted all aspects of our lives - nothing has been spared from this relentless barrage - not even our beloved church.

It now seems as though we never have time for everything that we try to pack into the day. Our days become longer and longer getting to a point where, Sunday, the one day that has always been reserved for worship and rest is now being encroached upon. It has now become secondary to the pressing needs of our secular life. As a result, church attendance has been declining over the last 60 years and overall commitment to the church for those that do attend

has fallen off sharply. As a result, many self-professed Christians lack the basic understanding of the truths that are found in scripture. Many also lack the deeper understanding of who we are and what we are called to do in this very broken world. This would explain why just days ago we celebrated the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Savior and within one short week we will be back to business as usual in our secular world with a lukewarm commitment to our calling as Christians.

So why does this happen? Maybe in our haste we fail to hear the true meaning of Christmas, the deeper meaning of what this time of the year should mean to all of us. Maybe we miss it because of all of the noise that distracts us from our commitments as Christians, making the transition to our "business as usual" in the New Year an easy transition. Either way, it must end. We worship a God that is immutable that is not changing – His truths are unchanging overtime. He provides us the one thing in the world that does not change with the whims of society giving us

an anchor to hold us steady in a sea of change and uncertainty.

If we are to call ourselves Christians committed to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, we must end this destructive cycle that prevents us from avoiding the source of so much pain and brokenness in our lives. As Christians, we are called to be Christmas and Easter people year-round. Through Jesus we have a foretaste of the ultimate fulfillment of God's plan for creation. Jesus provides us the much-needed spiritual path to eternal life. Without Jesus at the center of our lives every day – we are empty vessels devoid of all that is life sustaining that is received through our faith in Christ. We must find the time to celebrate every day the One that brings eternal life to us.

To do this, we must understand that there is more to the coming of the Christ child than the commercialism of exchanging gifts and celebrating with our friends and family. We are called to fully embrace the Reign of Christ – to understand what accepting the Lordship of Jesus Christ means to each and every one of us. This requires reprioritizing our lives so that Christ is first and foremost in every decision that we make. This commitment requires a counter cultural commitment where we use

Jesus as our role model – practicing radical hospitality and love, living sacrificial lives where we give of ourselves for the benefit of others, by practicing tolerance, living in community, and doing all that we are called to do in our efforts to carry out the mission of the Church, which means that each of us will: 1. Proclaim the gospel, seek, welcome, and gather persons into the body of Christ;

2. Lead persons to commit their lives to God through baptism by water and the spirit and profession of faith in Jesus Christ;

3. Nurture people in Christian living through worship, the sacraments, spiritual disciplines;

4. Send people into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, caring for the stranger, freeing the oppressed, being and becoming a compassionate, caring presence, and working to develop social structures that are consistent with the gospel and;

5. Continue the mission of seeking, welcoming, and

gathering persons into the community of the body of Christ.

TRUSTEES NEWS

The Trustees last meeting for 2023 was in November. The group discussed allocating money for the purchase of some new audiovisual equipment to enhance our online presence. We also discussed some options to enhance the sound for those who have more difficulty hearing during the live service. More information is being gathered as there are various options to assist those who need it. The Board of Zoning appeals variance that was requested to the Town of Boonsboro was submitted and the hearing was on November 21. The request was to subdivide the Clopper house property into 2 parcels. As this request was denied, the group will need to decide on next steps after the first of the year.

Several of the Trustees refreshed the mulch on the Ark playground and the larger playground in November. Other church members are keeping salt in the water softener every month. The elevator inspection took place in November and our elevator passed. Thanks to all members who help to keep our facility in good repair. Thanks, also, to our sextons who are very faithful about keeping our facility clean. For the first time, the Planet Aid collection container was full and we had to notify the company. That's good news for our church as we receive some funds from that effort. Please continue to support our church building and grounds as many hands make light work!


MT. NEBO YOUTH NEWS

GRANT FOR THE YOUTH
