This month, on Pentecost Sunday, we will be celebrating one of the most exciting days in our Christian year. It is the birthday of the church, it marks the arrival of the "Helper" promised by Jesus to his disciples in the Gospel of John 14:26. In it, Jesus declares, "The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send you in my name...will teach you all things and bring to you remembrance of all I have said to you." This message is reaffirmed in the Nicene Creed, "We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, The Giver of Life; Who proceeds from the Father and the Son; Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and

On the arrival of the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost Sunday, with authority, Peter said to the crowd, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Peter, the rock on which Christ would build his Church, was fully transformed

glorified; Who spoke through the proph-

from being a brash and aggressive "bumpkin" to that of a leading shepherd, feeding Christ's sheep and baptizing 3000 people in one day!

Since that time, this special day has become a traditional day for baptisms, confirmations, and for new members to join the church in Christian denominations worldwide. This year, on **May 19, 2024**, we will follow that tradition when our 2024 class of Confirmands become members of Mt Nebo UMC. It will also be a time that is open for those wishing to join the church to make that final commitment.

From the earliest times, the church has recognized the importance of the Holy Spirit as being active in the conviction of sin, the power of regeneration and rebirth in the lives of believers. The church also recognizes that the Spirit is also responsible for the distribution of spiritual gifts and

the empowerment for Christian service to the world, as well as being active in the work of sanctification, the illumination of scripture, and the personal guidance of believers. The Spirit gives life and wisdom to those who believe – helping us, guiding us, in our brokenness and the brokenness of the world as we await the coming of the Final Judgment Day.

So what are we to do as we await the coming of the Final Judgement Day? The founder of our Methodist tradition, John Wesley, believed that we should continue to perfect ourselves in love and

that we should continually strive for Christian perfection on our path to sanctification. After "being made right before God" or justified, and after receiving the assurance of our salvation by the Holy Spirit, we must continue in the works that Jesus began here during his earthly ministry. We must feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and visit the prisoners. We find this mandate in the Gospel of Matthew 25:34-37, "Then the king will say to those at his right hand,

"Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36 I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." It was also given to us in prophecy in the Old Testament in Isaiah, 61;1-2, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prisons to those who are bound; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

In the instance we are born again, we are inwardly renewed by the power of God. Our hearts are filled with the love of God by the Holy Spirit.

When this happens, "we no longer have the love for worldly things in our life. The love of pleasure, of ease, of honor, of money together with pride, anger, self-will and every other evil temper. By the Spirit of God our earthly sensual, devilish mind is changed into the mind which was in Christ Jesus." According to Marjorie Thompson, "In Christian theology and experience, the work of the Holy Spirit, is to conform us to the image of Christ. We see in Genesis 1:26-27 that the human creature was made in the image and likeness of God, yet we obscured and distorted that image in the Fall. Christ is the image of the invisible God in all its original purity... When we are clothed with Christ, the truth of our humanity is restored and the image of our Creator begins to emerge with clarity through the Spirit of God."

As we enter into this new church season of Pentecost, may God pour out His Holy Spirit on us all as we work to be Kingdom Builders in this broken world. Let us receive the blessing of Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit as we live in Christian love and witness to the power of forgiveness in our homes, in our communities, and to the ends of the earth, until that day when Christ returns in glory. Amen.

OUT OF AFRICA



MUSIC NOTES

I recently experienced Maasai music in Maasai Land with Mt. Kilimanjaro in the background. (I'm planning to give a full mission report on **Wednesday, May 22 at 6:30 p.m.**). As I listened to the chanting and echo of their music without being able to understand the words, both at the villages, and then at church, I studied the musicality. Their music was based on a five-note scale, *the Pentatonic Scale*. The lower voices sang the same notes an octave lower. There was little harmony, but when they did sing in harmony it reminded me of music I had heard in Asia. Yes, the Chinese use the same scale in their music.

I thought about our Praise Music when our mission group sang the Praise Song "Alleluia" by VOUS Worship much to the delight of the people, who laughed with joy at hearing notes they had never heard before. Most Praise Music, including Praise Hymns, are written in the *Major Scale*. This scale is characterized by its bright and uplifting sounds. The stability and resolution contribute to the sense of celebration and worship in Christian congregational singing.

I couldn't help but compare it to some of the music we played during the Lenten season. Lenten Music most often uses the *Phrygian Scale*. For example, in the key of C, the *C Phrygian Scale* consists of the notes: C, Db, Eb, F, G, Ab, Bb, and then back to C. These flattened notes create tension, pathos, and conveys a somber mood.

MUSIC NOTES CONTINUED...

Science cannot explain why some scales and rhythms impact us the way they do. As a little baby if my parents played music in a minor key I would cry. They thought it was funny and would quickly change back to a major key so my tears would stop. Making sure it was not a fluke, they would periodically try a "sad" song versus a "happy" song. Think of your family's musical traditions and spiritual purposes. "What am I to do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will pray with my mind also; I will sing praise with my spirit, but I will sing with my mind also." 1 Corinthians 14:15
