Last month, we spent several weeks in chapter 12 of the Gospel of Luke. The context of this chapter is set within the broader narrative of Jesus' journey towards Jerusalem where he ultimately faced his crucifixion. These teachings were shared with a diverse audience mostly Jewish, consisting of both disciples and a crowd of people who desired to understand the teachings of Jesus. Two thousand years later, this message is as relevant as when he shared it with his disciples and

crowd. We can feel the struggles that he experienced as our Lord, being both wholly human and wholly divine.

As Jesus nears the end of his final journey, his stress and anxiety can be seen in the Gospel account as he proclaims it in Luke 12:49-53, "I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and

what stress I am under until it is completed! Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division!" Is there anywhere else in the New Testament where we see Jesus so angry and frustrated? Is there another place in the New Testament where his humanness is so glaringly revealed and his words so sharp? It is as though he is giving a wakeup call to those following him with the belief that they would not be subject to judgment because they were God's chosen!

For many today, these statements are shocking coming from our beloved Jesus who is caring, compassionate, and full of love. The Jesus we all love reading about in the New Testament who is merciful and forgiving and always seeking to uplift us, so that we can live out our faith in the way that God created us to live. Maybe we fail to see Jesus as he really is – that we have created an image of him that affirms our beliefs and not his.

As we see his humanness on full display, are we

missing something because we are so used to seeing the divine side of Jesus that we are startled when we see his humanness? Were the crowds equally surprised? At that time most people regarded the Messiah as a conqueror and king. One that would vanquish all of the enemies of the people of Israel. A Messiah that would restore the past glory of King David's reign. Instead, they were seeing one that was willing to give up his life by the baptism with which he said that he must

be baptized – crucifixion on a cross. The one that would take on the sins of the world, so that those who believe in him will have eternal life. How do you see Jesus? Maybe the one to pray to for success in your life or for an ailing relative or friend. Prayers when needed, not an ongoing relationship. Only when times are tough and nothing else is working. A Jesus that could wait until you are

ready to accept him.

Jesus made it very clear that there would be judgment for the lack of faith and obedience to the Word of God and for all of the divisiveness over true belief in him. Like the Pharisees seeking to end his ministry by bringing charges against him. Like the Romans who were becoming increasingly concerned about the risk of insurrection that could possibly come about due to his radical teachings. And like how families had been divided by his presence. An occupied nation divided between those who followed and believed in him and those that sided with the orthodox religion and Romans – both seeing him as a threat. Has it changed any in our world today? We have 21st Century Pharisees who are more focused on rules and regulations that they willfully proclaim, often times ignoring the true will of God. We have seen families turning away from the church.

His message was clear to those that failed to believe in him and to be prepared. We see the warning in

Luke 12:39–40, "But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

As professing Christians, are you fooling yourself about what Jesus expects from each and every one of us – obedience to our heavenly Father, love and compassion for our neighbors? We see this mandate in Mark 12:30-31, "Love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love your neighbors as yourself."

So, when the time comes, how would you like God to find you? Will it be with your work completed? Jesus himself said in John 17:4, "I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do." When it is your time, will the work that has been given to you by God be complete? Will you be at peace with those around you? In Ephesians 4:26, the Apostle Paul, instructs us: "Do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil." When anger rules you, your heart becomes chained to the act of the offense, and your heart becomes controlled by the poison of the past. Choose to let the offense go. Choose to forgive and let God wash away the pain of the past. Lastly, let God find you at peace with him. Are you going to be a stranger or an enemy or fall asleep in the arms of God? Have you listened for his quiet voice guiding you? Have you been in regular prayer with our Lord - maintaining a close connection, not just praying when the need arises? Are you guided by what is found in scripture? If not, then maybe you should be fearful of the fire brought upon the earth from Iesus. Because no matter how much you may want to eliminate the element of justice from the message of Jesus, it remains stubbornly and unalterably there! Amen.



This fall we have around 161 children enrolled! In preparation for our fall program, our amazing teachers and staff set up their rooms and finalized all the special details that will help their students experience the magical feelings of being expected, welcomed, and loved as we start the new school year. All children will absolutely know they belong in their classroom, and that they are a cherished child of God!

For our 2025–2026 school year we will continue our strong Christian Education program and maintain our high-quality academics using MSDE Approved Creative Curriculum for all children. We will continue to provide nutritious snacks and lunch. We are so excited to start this new year!

As every parent knows, it only takes the smallest change to throw a child's day out of whack—A rough night of sleep, smaller-than-usual breakfast, a visiting relative to disrupt a child's natural sense of order and routine. We ask our parents to please let us know when anything different is happening in their child's life and this information helps us to better respond to the child's individual needs. No piece of information is too small.

We also require parents to check their child in and out through our Pro-care app by scanning the QR code or selecting the sign in/out option on their phones. One of our important policies stated in our parent handbook is that all children **MUST** arrive no later than 9 am each day! This policy will be strictly enforced this school year to ensure that there are no disruptions to our program.

We met with parents in the sanctuary for a short presentation, distributed updated parent handbooks, discussed changes in policies, important dates to remember and they met all our wonderful staff members. ### MICAH'S BACKPACK



### SHOEBOXES FOR OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

This holiday season, our church is partnering with **Samaritan's Purse** for **Operation Christmas Child**, a global outreach that delivers gift-filled shoeboxes to children in need across more than 170 countries. Each box is a tangible expression of God's love and often the very first gift a child has ever received.



Since 1993, over **232 million shoeboxes** have been distributed, and each one opens the door to share the Gospel through local churches. Many recipients also participate in *The Greatest Journey*, a 12-lesson discipleship course that helps children grow in their faith.

### What Can You Pack in a Shoebox?

Each shoebox should be packed with **fun, useful, and heartfelt items**. Choose a gender and age group (2 –4, 5–9, or 10–14 years), then fill your box with a mix

of suggested items such as:

- **WOW items**: Soccer ball (deflated with pump), doll, stuffed animal, musical instrument
- **Toys**: Puzzles, jump ropes, cars, action figures, building blocks, yo-yos
- **School supplies**: Pencils, pens, crayons, notebooks, erasers, rulers
- **Personal care**: Toothbrush, washcloth, comb, hair-brush, band-aids
- Accessories: Socks, hats, t-shirts, jewelry, sunglasses
- Extras: Flashlight (with batteries), reusable water bottle, small tools (no blades), photo and personal note



### **Items NOT Allowed**

To ensure safe and smooth delivery, **please do NOT include** the following: candy, gum, chocolate, food, toothpaste, soap, lotions, liquids, medications, vitamins, war-related toys (guns, knives, military figures), breakable items (glass, snow globes), aerosol cans, seeds, fruit snacks, drink mixes, used or damaged items, matches or anything combustible, Bibles (each child receives a Gospel booklet in their language).

### How to Get Involved

- Pick up a shoebox at church or use a standard-sized shoebox
- Pack your box and pray over it
- Include a \$10 donation for shipping (online or in the box)

Return your filled box by **November 9, 2025**.

Let's come together to bless children with the joy of Christmas and the hope of Christ.

Every shoebox is a seed of love that can grow into a life transformed by the Gospel.
