This year as we enter the First Sunday of the Advent Season, we will be reading Matthew 24: 36 -44, "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

Many of you may find it strange that our scrip-

ture lesson on the First Sunday of Advent starts off with such a dire prophecy about the end times. You may feel, as many do, that we should be reading about the joy of the coming birth of Jesus, rather than the doom and gloom of

the end times. This belief is common in today's church because the ancient tradition of reading stories of the end of the world as preparation for Advent has long since been abandoned, even though it remains in our lectionary readings as a reminder of the deeper meaning of the Advent Season.

Instead of encouraging us to prepare for the

celebration of Christ's birth by decorating, throwing parties and spending lavishly in order to shower our friends and family with gifts, the ancient tradition of the church invites us into a period of self-examination and repentance. It is the opposite of what the world tells us to do - it is countercultural. It tells us to do the exact opposite of what we find going on in this world. It tells us to prepare for the birth of Jesus into the world and for his coming again, by living as people who are prepared to die. This notion definitely lacks the festive holiday spirit. However, it is a vital alternative to what the world offers in preparation for the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ into the world and his coming again.

So, how can we participate in the coming reign of Christ? That is what the true challenge of Advent is all about. God promises us a new order, the birth of a world in which justice and righteousness rule. Whether we are among those who will be reborn with that world depends upon our commitment and allegiance, in each moment of our lives,

> to the one true God, rather than the false gods we so often honor. God shows us the way in the life and words of Jesus, and gives us companions - our sisters and brothers in Christ. But ultimately, each of us must actively prepare

if we are to be part of what is being born at Christmas. So, what do we have to do to prepare?

First of all, we have to prepare ourselves by examining our lives and repenting and turning away from those things that are not life-giving. When we accept the Lordship of Jesus Christ, we begin to look at the world differently. We start to prioritize our life around putting our faith in Jesus

as first and foremost in our lives. Love and compassion begin to replace our selfish earthly cravings for material wealth and luxury. We begin to see the brokenness of the world more clearly and strive to serve as Disciples of Christ in all aspects of our lives – not just once a week for an hour on Sunday but every day.

We have to live whatever time we have left on this earth in the ways that Jesus came into this world to teach us. This means that we need to model our lives after the life of Jesus. We should be guided by the Gospel accounts of how Jesus made a difference in the lives of everyone he came into contact with during his ministry. His compassion, his love, his desire to submit fully to the holy will of the heavenly Father, and his ultimate sacrifice for our salvation, should be a powerful lesson for all of us to follow.

We have to participate in the healing of the world. This means that we need to go out into the world and "live our faith" in the brokenness of the world. We must work to be agents of transformation – seeking to make disciples of everyone we encounter on our faith journey.

We must offer the prospect of the hope, peace, joy, and love that Jesus was born into this world to share. Each week of Advent we light a symbolic candle for one of the four virtues that Jesus brings to us. As we light these candles, we must recommit ourselves to bringing hope to those that have lost hope, bringing peace by being peacemakers in a

gan waving frantically. I tried to keep directing while looking to see if a hornet or bee was buzzing near the child, but seeing nothing, I thought he was just being silly. But he kept waving harder, looking straight at his mom in the congregation. All of a sudden, he yelled out, "MOM! I have to go potty RIGHT NOW!" "Go now!" I mouthed while incorporating an exit motion into my conducting.

The congregation burst into laughter; the soundtrack kept going. Half of the children began to giggle, but with a single look from me, they pulled it all together. The little boy made it back in time for the last chorus and sang with renewed gusto, "Joy to the World . . .Repeat, repeat, the sounding joy!" We ended the song to thunderous applause.

Still smiling, the pastor began his sermon with, "Well, that's one way to make sure you get everyone's attention before the sermon begins!"

Children have a way of reminding us that life doesn't always go as planned. In church, as in life, interruptions happen—and sometimes they're even funny. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (Matthew 19:14).

That morning, the children's imperfect performance brought more joy and laughter than a flaw-less one could have ever brought. (In fact, I don't even remember the flawless ones.) It reminded the congregation that God values sincerity over perfection. Just like that little boy, we can come to God honestly, just as we are, knowing He delights in our presence.

TRUSTEE NEWS EXCITING IMPROVEMENTS AT MT. NEBO

Over the past few months, the Trustees have been hard at work addressing several improvements that directly support the worship experience and visibility of our church. Many of you have already noticed the **upgrades to our sanctuary sound system**, including new speakers and equipment. These improvements were made in response to feedback from our congregation, and we are pleased to say that clarity and consistency of sound have already greatly improved.

In addition, we are in the process of installing a **new full-matrix LED signboard,** replacing our current static sign. This will give our church a brighter, clearer, and more effective way to share events, ministries, and community messages with everyone who passes by. Permitting for the sign is currently underway, and we are excited for the increased visibility this will bring to Mt. Nebo.

NEW VISION FOR OUR OUTDOOR CLASSROOM

Another major initiative is the long-term reconstruction of the outdoor classroom area, formerly known as the playscape. Our goal is to create a **safer, more functional, and weather-ready**

environment where our children can learn, explore, and grow. We are working with our design team to develop a full master plan—one that includes improved structures, protection from the elements, proper facilities, and a layout that reflects the excellence our church strives to provide.

We want our outdoor classroom to be the leading outdoor facility in the area. To create a space that is safe, modern, and centered around learning and creativity.

REIMAGINING THE THIRD FLOOR

During our November meeting, we discussed another exciting project: the future of the third **floor**. The area has served as storage for years, but with fresh vision—and architectural design work beginning soon—we hope to develop it into a truly functional ministry space. Potential uses include Sunday School rooms, a learning center, community activity areas, or flexible multi-use spaces. Please share with us your vision and we would love to try and incorporate any ideas that could benefit our facility. Feel free to reach out to Gary Harding with your ideas. Next, to prepare for this design phase, we will need to clear out the third floor including old electronics, unused furniture, and miscellaneous stored items.
